He is a member of the Deliberative Council of the International Celso Furtado Center of Studies on Development and Coordinator at ANPOCS (National Association of Graduate Research on Social Sciences) of the Working Group on Theory and Practice of South-South Relations.

Rafael Osorio has a PhD in Sociology from UNB (Federal University of Brasilia) and does research on poverty, inequality, social stratification and social policies at the Institute of Applied Economic Research (IPEA) and at the International Policy Centre for Inclusive Growth (IPC-IG). Currently, he is advisor to the Head of the Secretariat of Strategic Affairs of the Brazilian Government.

Edgard Rodriguez is Senior Program Specialist for “Supporting Inclusive Growth” at IDRC. He holds a PhD in Economics from the University of Toronto with specialization in economic development and labour economics. He has plenty of experience on small-enterprise development and labour markets in Asian and Latin American Economics.
